❖ Capital Project Updates

- The Brentwood Park playground replacement project is in preliminary design. Staff are coordinating community meetings to be held at the park and at a Parks and Community Services Commission meeting.
- The Fairview Park Master Plan Update process is officially underway, with a kickoff meeting held in February. Updates on progress and community input are forthcoming.
- Two capital projects have been designated funding through Orange County Supervisor Katrina Foley's Office. The projects include the expansion of the Costa Mesa Skatepark and the completion of the Café at Lion's Park. Both projects are currently in the pre-design phase.
- One capital project, the Expansion of Ketchum-Libolt Park, has been designated funding through Assemblywoman Cottie-Petrie Norris' Office. This project is also in pre-design. Staff have met with a potential project manager that would likely focus on community outreach for the project.
- Four (4) other sites have been designated as locations for funding provided through Senator Dave Min's Office. These project sites include the Jack Hammett Sports Complex, TeWinkle Park, Fairview Park, and Shalimar Park. Actual project scope for each site is still under review, with public comment opportunities currently in the works. A community outreach meeting is currently being discussed internally and will be shared with the Commission when details are final.
