Brenda,

Please do not certify the 2024 Municipal Election for Costa Mesa until further investigation is completed. Here are the facts:

After 11/5/24. Voting Center votes still came in with more votes for Costa Mesa despite being closed, no machines and no people were there. 1,131 additional votes were processed.

For Costa Mesa 13,441 more ballots were mailed than Registered Voters out to Costa Mesa residents - 74,320 Ballots mailed out to 60,789 Registered Voters. These ballots were enough to change any of the election results.

Signature Verification at the Orange County Registrar's Office was sickening at identifying bad vs. good signatures. There was no way to challenge. 1/5 of signatures should have never been approved. Station 15 was one of the worst - he was also manager for 20 signature verification stations.

The Hart software has a glitch. The poll worker would mark a signature as bad but then when the screen changed you could see the computer change it to good.

There was an algorithm/ PID controller changing the daily totals in favor of the Democrats. That is mathematically impossible.

Observers like myself were denied access to watch the counting - 11/9/24 @ 4 PM.

The Hart Intercivic Voting machines do not have certification from the CA Secretary of State nor are they certified by the Election Assistance Commission - please look at both websites and review the documents. Both are required by State Law and Federal HAVA law to be certified before being used in elections.

Half of the Registrar's Dell Workstations that were provided information on a California Public Records request had been purchased with internal modems. This is another violation of State and Federal Election law and cannot be used in our elections.

Bob Page has admitted in a lawsuit that both the Poll Books and the Election Management System for the OC ROV are on the Internet. This is an election law violation of 19205. It renders the voters rolls and the counting to vulnerabilities presented by hackers with viruses, PID Controllers and alteration of the voter rolls and election results.

On 11/6 the Secretary of State reported OC had 864,111 VBM ballots with 13,558 left to review. On 11/8 the SOS reported OC suddenly had VBM 1,093,896 with 323,128 left to review. There was a bomb scare on 11/8 and 11/9. Observers were escorted off the property by Sheriffs, the OC ROV workers remained in the building while two white unmarked vans drove up to the back of the warehouse. That was when the spike of 300k additional ballots occurred. There are no receipts by the OC ROV showing that 300k ballots arrived during that time.
