
### **PROJECT OVERVIEW**

### Scope of Work:

- New signing, striping, and bicycle facility improvements on:
  - ➤ Placentia Avenue from Adams Avenue to West 16th Street
  - ➤ West 19th Street from Sundance Drive to Pomona Avenue
- Street rehabilitation along East 17th Street between Fullerton Avenue to Newport Boulevard







### **PROJECT OVERVIEW**

 Pedestrian Enhancements to Provide:

New signalized crossing at the intersection of West 19th Street & Wallace Avenue

 Installation of new concrete curb bulbouts, and crosswalk markings.

 Pedestrian hybrid beacon/HAWK signals, signage, and crosswalk markings to be installed at:

- W 18th Street at Lions Park
- Wilson Street at Wilson Park





# PROJECT BENEFITS - W 19<sup>th</sup> St at Wallace Ave

New traffic signal will improve

pedestrian mobility and promote safer crossings including Leading Pedestrian Intervals.

Video detection will improve bicycle mobility and access.

New concrete bulb-outs will enhance visibility, shorten pedestrian crossing distances, and encourage slower vehicle speeds.

Project enhances pedestrian environment and promotes walking to retail shops and restaurants from nearby residential areas.








### Recommendation


- 1. Award a Professional Services Agreement to Moore, lacofano, Goltsman, Inc. in the amount of \$314,565 for professional consulting and environmental planning services for the Fairview Park Master Plan Update project.
- 2. Authorize a ten-percent (10% contingency), if needed, for unforeseen costs.
- 3. Authorize an additional expense appropriation of \$64,565 from the Park Development Fees fund balance to cover the requested contracted value for the Fairview Park Master Plan Update.
- 4. Authorize the City Manager and City Clerk to execute the P.S.A. and future amendments to the agreement within Council-authorized limits.





## Fairview Park Master Plan Background

- Fairview Park Master Plan adopted in 1998
- Minor revisions adopted in 2001, 2002
- Updated Biological Survey completed in 2008
- Voters approved Measure AA in 2016
- During FY 19-20 budget adoption, City Council approved the Fairview Park Master Plan Update project for future restoration, enhancement, management







## Request for Proposal (RFP) Process

- Scope development with stakeholders
- RFP issued on August 11, 2022
- Proposals received September 8, 2022
- Three proposals received:
  - Moore, Iacofano, Goltsman (MIG) Inc.
  - OLIN Partnership, Ltd.
  - Endemic Environmental Services
- Proposals evaluated by panel of subject matter experts





## **Master Plan Design Elements**

- Diversity of rare and endangered species, protected habitats
- Archeological sites, significant cultural resources
- Prior and ongoing restoration projects, mitigation sites
- Bluffs, canyon, grassland, coastal sage scrub, riparian, vernal pool and wetland habitats
- Passive recreational opportunities, trails,
- Extremely high biodiversity, ecological value acre-foracre








## Scope of Work – Key Tasks

- Historical Summary / Review of Existing Documentation
- Community Outreach
- Resource Assessment and Analysis of Existing Conditions
- Master Plan Update Findings and Recommendations
- Environmental Documentation







## **Sub-task: Tribal Advisory Committee**

- Tribal Advisory Committee (TAC) comprised of tribal representatives connected to the site
- Recognizes tribal sovereignty and sensitivity of cultural resources
- Provide dedicated meetings to obtain tribal input
- Promote further partnerships and collaboration with tribal stakeholders








## **Master Plan Objectives**

- Engage stakeholders in developing a blueprint for restoration, preservation, education, and compatible recreation
- Recognize adopted/completed concepts and projects
- Recognize ongoing operations and management activities
- Utilize geospatial tools to inventory existing resources and assets
- Incorporate current policies and laws to account for required resource protection measures
- Preserve the park as a unique environmental resource for current and future generations
