Our dental center serves children from 8 AM - 4 PM on Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Fridays and we offer clothing and school supplies at several distribution days in the summer and fall to local school children in need (as identified by the Newport-Mesa Unified School District).

A low wall separates our property from the back of the proposed dispensary location. The report notes that the anticipated trips were developed using the building classification of "pharmacy/drug store". Has ITE published documentation confirming this is an accurate classification to be used for a dispensary in generating trips? If not, what measures or studies have been performed by the applicant to confirm the classification will accurately estimate the anticipated trips? Additionally per the report the generated trips are to be reviewed during peak hours. It would seem a retail facility would generate significant peak hour trips while a medical office's trips would have significantly less peak hour trips and be distributed throughout the day.

I would like to request the documentation which staff used to "determined that the proposed use does not meet the threshold for requiring a traffic study" be made public and additionally request that final determination on this application be delayed until the documentation is provided to the public for review and comment.
