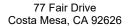

WHEREAS, Bryce Sheridan played on the Costa Mesa High school and Orange Coast College golf teams; and

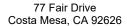
WHEREAS, Bryce Sheridan won the 49th annual Will Jordan Classic, where he shot seven under for a total gross score of 135; and

WHEREAS, the City of Costa Mesa is committed to taking steps to combat hunger in every part of our community and to providing additional resources that residents in our community need; and

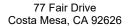

WHEREAS, in 2008, the United States Senate passed U.S. Senate Resolution 644 designating National Child Awareness Month; and

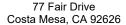
WHEREAS, numerous individuals and youth-serving organizations work directly with children and youth daily to provide invaluable services that have a direct and lasting effect on their lives; and

BACKGROUND:

Pursuant to AB 361, the City Council will need to declare every 30 days that the City's legislative bodies and individual members can continue to meet remotely, <u>as needed</u>, in order to ensure the health and safety of the members and the public.

On September 17, 2021 the Governor signed into law AB 361, which allows local legislative bodies to continue to meet remotely, and waive certain posting requirements if:

- The local agency holds a meeting during a declared state of emergency;
- State or local health officials have imposed or recommended measures to promote social distancing; and
- Legislative bodies declare the need to meet remotely due to present risks to the health or safety of all attendees.

ANALYSIS:

The City meets the requirements of AB 361 to continue holding meetings remotely in order to ensure the health and safety of the members, public and its employees. Both the California Department of Public Health and the County of Orange Public Health Officer have issued recommendations that members of vulnerable populations (such as older adults and those persons with an elevated risk due to certain medical conditions) continue to practice social distancing. The City cannot ensure social distancing requirements are always met inside the Council Chambers and/or Conference Rooms where the City Council, Commissions, and Committees meet, making it difficult for members of these bodies, City staff, and members of the public to consistently socially distance from each other with absolute certainty.

Staff recommends that the City Council adopt the proposed resolution making the required findings that the City Council, Commission and Committee meetings can continue to meet remotely, as needed, pursuant to the requirements of AB 361.

ALTERNATIVES:

City Council may choose not to hold City Council, Commission and Committee meetings remotely via Zoom. The City would then be required to hold all public meetings in-person.

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends the City Council:

- 1. Authorize City Manager or designee, to enter into a purchase agreement for four (4) ambulances through the Houston-Galveston Area Council of Governments (H-GAC) Buy Coop Purchasing contract # AM10-20 with Redsky Emergency Vehicles (Attachment 1), and secure funding through a master lease agreement.
- 2. Authorize the City Manager and City Clerk to execute the necessary documents to acquire the additional ambulances

BACKGROUND:

In July 2013, the City purchased six (6) custom 2013 Horton Model 623 rescue ambulances from Leader Industries. Navistar International Corporation ("Navistar") MaxxForce 7 engines were installed in all six vehicles. All six ambulances went into service in approximately the middle of 2014.

Approximately six months after the vehicles first went into service, the City started experiencing issues with the ambulances. Upon investigation of the issue, the City determined that all six ambulances were "growing oil". This meant the Navistar engines were flooding the cylinders with fuel during the regeneration process.

Between September 2016 and July 2020, the Fire and Rescue Department staff attempted to work with Navistar to resolve the issue. During this time, Navistar had repairs performed on all six vehicles to attempt to correct the issue. Ultimately, the power plants in all six vehicles were replaced between October 2019 and February 2020. Neither the repairs nor the power plant replacements resolved the issue.

Between February 2021 and November 2021, the City Attorney's Office and Fire and Rescue Department staff communicated with Navistar representatives to discuss potential resolutions, as the engine defects performed could not be corrected.

In December of 2021, the City received and accepted a legal settlement from Navistar International Corporation for \$500,000, which was set-aside for the unresolved and non-repairable engine defects. The majority of the settlement funds was used to purchase two ambulances.

ANALYSIS:

Public Works Department's Fleet staff has to service each ambulance every 14 days to ensure the ambulances are operational until the needed replacement units can be obtained. Due to the ambulance situation, the replacement parts are not readily available.

This results in that any given time there is at least one ambulance out of service for extended repairs as a result of the above mentioned engine defect. This level of continued mechanical service is not sustainable over the long-term.

As a result of the settlement, all current ambulances have an "as is" status and are no longer supported by the manufacturer. All six current ambulances continue to have the same engine defect and are not sustainable for long-term emergency service.

On June 7, 2022, City Council approved the purchase of two (2) replacement ambulances using the same cooperative agreement. It is staff's recommendation to replace the remaining four ambulances to ensure continued ambulance services for our community.

The City recommends utilizing the Houston-Galveston Area Council of Governments (H-GAC) Buy Coop Purchasing contract with Redsky Emergency Vehicles (Attachment 3) for the procurement of the four (4) additional ambulances. The agreement meets all of the City's purchasing requirements and all requirements set forth Section 2-165 (b) (5) of the Costa Mesa Municipal Code, which allows the City to purchase goods, supplies and services through cooperative agreements to receive competitive pricing.

ALTERNATIVES:

The City Council can provide alternative direction to staff.

FISCAL REVIEW:

The cost to replace the four (4) ambulances is estimated at \$841,068 (Attachment 2). The City received a \$500,000 settlement in 2021-2022, of which the majority was used to purchase two (2) ambulances. Staff is recommending that City Council authorize the City Manager and/or Finance Director to enter into a master lease agreement for funding of the four (4) additional ambulances.

BACKGROUND:

On June 2, 2020, the City Council awarded a construction contract to Nationwide for the Citywide Parkway Project - Maintenance Zones 6 and 7.

The City conducts an annual capital improvement program repairing, improving, and installing existing and new concrete parkway infrastructure. The scope of work for the Citywide Parkway Project ("Project") consists of localized reconstruction of curb and gutter, cross gutters and spandrels, sidewalks, driveway approaches, accessible ramps, new concrete sidewalks, and other work needed to complete the Project in accordance with the project specifications.

Concrete improvements located within the City's parkways and streets require ongoing repair and maintenance due to age, maturing trees, soil conditions, water intrusion, and traffic loads.

The parkway improvements are citywide, but the project focused on Maintenance Zones 6 and 7, which comprise of the City's Westside neighborhoods, south of West 19th Street and west of Newport Boulevard.

In addition, new sidewalks were installed along Mesa Drive between Orange Avenue and Club Mesa Place; along Charle Street between Bernard Street and Hamilton Street; and along Bernard Street between Maple Avenue and Harbor Boulevard.

ANALYSIS:

The work required by the contract documents was completed on August 1, 2022 to the satisfaction of the City Engineer. The final contract cost amounted to \$3,532,547. A report of the final costs is included as Attachment 1.

A summary of the costs is as follows:

Final Contract Cost:	\$3,532,547

The final contract cost reflects a 5.7% increase to the original contract amount. The increase is attributable to the driveway repair work at Fire Station No. 4 and added parkway work along Bernard Street, Charle Street, Redwood Avenue, Sandalwood Street, Wake Forest Road, and West 18th Street.

As of this date, there are no Stop Notices filed against the monies due to Nationwide.

BACKGROUND:

The City of Costa Mesa has been participating in the EMPG Program since 2001. The purpose of the program is to encourage the development of comprehensive emergency management at the local levels and to encourage the improvement of mitigation, preparedness, response, and recovery capabilities for all hazards. The program provides minimal fiscal support for the City's efforts in emergency management, disaster preparedness, training, and plans development.

The County of Orange is a grant recipient of the EMPG Program, and participating local jurisdictions, including Costa Mesa, are subrecipients. Annually, the County of Orange, acting through the Sheriff-Coroner Department/Emergency Management Division, in its capacity as the lead agency for the Operational Area, applies for, receives, and accepts the EMPG Program funds from the California Governor's Office of Emergency Services.

For Fiscal Year 2021, Costa Mesa has been awarded \$17,429 in EMPG funds. In order to receive the 2021 EMPG grant funds, the City is required to execute the attached Agreement. Once the County of Orange receives the executed agreement and copy of the resolution authorizing the application for and acceptance of program funds, the County will transfer grant funds to the City, in arrears, for reimbursement of reasonable and permissible expenditures under the grant.

ANALYSIS:

The City puts forth a significant effort towards citywide training, exercises and planning to ensure a state of readiness for emergencies and/or disasters. The EMPG Program focuses on the area of multi-agency coordination in preparedness for City employees and volunteers to support an Emergency Operations Center (EOC) activation during times of major emergencies and/or disasters.

The City has been awarded an amount not-to-exceed \$17,429 in 2021 EMPG funds for Fiscal Year 2021. The 2021 EMPG grant funds will be used to purchase technology equipment for the City's EOC.

The grant funding amount is sufficient to cover all costs associated with the equipment purchase.

<u>ALTERNATIVES:</u>

The City Council may elect not to participate in the EMPG Program. However, this alternative is not recommended as the City would miss a funding opportunity that would help support the City's Emergency Preparedness Response and recovery efforts in preparing for a major disaster and/or emergency. The City must participate in activities required by the program to be prepared for and assist the community in mitigation, preparedness, response, and recovery efforts prior to and after any major disaster and/or emergency.

FISCAL REVIEW:

Upon approval of the Agreement and acceptance of the 2021 EMPG Program, revenue and expense appropriations in the amount of \$17,429 respectively will be established for the grant.

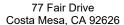

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends the City Council:

- 1. Authorize the City Manager or designee to increase the City's table of organization to account for eleven (11) full-time custody staff to facilitate Costa Mesa Jail Operations.
- 2. Adopt Resolution Number 2022-XX, which amends Resolution Number 2022-35, establishing the new Custody Supervisor classification and corresponding salary range.
- 3. Authorize the appropriation of \$175,215 from the General Fund's (101) fund balance for Police Department custody staff to facilitate Costa Mesa Jail Operations.

BACKGROUND:

In June 2013, the City of Costa Mesa began contracting for jail services with G4S Secure Solutions (USA) Inc. ("G4S"). The contract was for a three-year term, with the option to extend the term of the contract for two additional one-year periods. The City and G4S exercised the extension options, extending the term through June 25, 2018.

In November 2017, the City released a Request for Proposal (RFP No. 18-06) for jail services in anticipation of the current G4S contract expiring on June 25, 2018. The City received one response to the RFP, which was from G4S. The proposal was for jail services at a cost not-to-exceed: Year 1 - \$851,261; Year 2 - \$887,491; and Year 3 - \$924,098. The proposed contract with G4S contained two additional one-year extension options, the first of which was exercised in June 2021, with an expiration date of June 30, 2022 at an annual cost not-to-exceed \$924,098. In March of 2022, G4S was purchased by Allied Universal, which agreed to continue jail services under the same contract agreement.

In May 2022, Allied Universal was unable to meet Costa Mesa's jail services needs pursuant to the contract. On May 17, 2022, City Council approved the termination of the professional services agreement for jail services between Allied Universal, assignor of G4S Secure Solutions (USA) Inc.

and the City of Costa Mesa, and authorized the City Manager or designee to negotiate an agreement with the City of Huntington Beach for temporary jail services and/or to hire temporary staffing to operate the Costa Mesa Jail.

To mitigate the impact on police operations, seven (7) temporary part-time custody officers have been hired. However, this is not a permanent solution in resolving the staffing requirements to safely operate the jail.

ANALYSIS:

The City's Type 1 jail facility is operational 24 hours a day, 365 days a year and governed by the Board of State and Community Corrections (BSCC). Title 15 requires a sufficient number of properly trained personnel be employed in each local detention facility to ensure the safety of personnel and arrestees.

To move forward with a permanent solution, staff is recommending the City hire full-time custody staff as city employees. In order to provide the required staffing levels, one (1) newly established full-time classification of Custody Supervisor and ten (10) Custody Officer positions is recommended. This has been the Jail's staffing level for the past nine years and has been approved by the BSCC for safe operation. The annual contract rate for FY 22-23 with Allied Universal was proposed at \$945,502. The annual cost moving forward with the additional staff would be approximately \$1.12 million, which is lower than the City's FY 2012-13 budgeted cost for jail services of \$1.3 million.

ALTERNATIVES:

The City Council could decide not to authorize the hiring of full-time custody staff to facilitate the City jail; however, if the jail facility is closed, officers would be required to complete the booking process themselves and transport the arrestees directly to Orange County Jail in Santa Ana. This is not recommended because it would negatively impact police services by delaying response times in jurisdiction.

FISCAL REVIEW:

The City's cost for jail services is budgeted annually based upon the approved and active contract for jail services. The allocation budget for jail services through Allied Universal for FY 22-23 is \$945,502. Upon City Council approval, an additional appropriation of \$175,215 from the General Fund's (101) fund balance will be added to the Police Department's FY 22-23 Operating Budget.

LEGAL REVIEW:

The City Attorney's Office has reviewed this report and approved as to form.

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends the City Council:

- 1. Approve the proposed Resolution No. 2022-XX, which ratifies the application for a grant award from the State of California Office of Traffic Safety (OTS) for the Selective Traffic Enforcement Program (STEP) and authorizes the City Manager or designee to execute all grant documents, including the Grant Agreement, and accept and administer the grant.
- 2. Approve revenue and expense appropriations in the amount of \$265,000 respectively, for the 2022-23 OTS STEP grant.

BACKGROUND:

The National Highway Transportation Safety Administration distributes federal funding to California through the Office of Traffic Safety. Grants are used to mitigate traffic safety program deficiencies, expand ongoing programs, and/or to develop new programs. Grant funding cannot replace existing program expenditures, nor can traffic safety funds be used for program maintenance, research, rehabilitation, and/or construction. The Costa Mesa Police Department has been awarded similar grants in the past, which have significantly assisted the objectives of the Traffic Safety Bureau and improved traffic safety for residents and visitors in Costa Mesa.

ANALYSIS:

Since 2005, the Office of Traffic Safety has awarded the Costa Mesa Police Department 17 traffic safety related grants. The funds associated with these grants were used to purchase specialized equipment and to fund the cost of personnel working targeted traffic operations.

The Office of Traffic Safety assembles collision data rankings based on city population numbers. The most recent year of compiled statistics used by OTS was from 2019. Costa Mesa was then ranked with 58 other cities with a population of 100,001-250,000.

Along with injury collisions, impaired driving enforcement has always been a top priority for the Costa Mesa Police Department. From 1986-2014, the Department staffed a full-time impaired driving enforcement team consisting of two (2) full-time officers. However, based on Police Department contraction in previous years, the full-time DUI Team was discontinued in 2014. The DUI team was re-established in January 2019; however, it was suspended due to staffing challenges. The DUI Team was again established in January 2021. The previous STEP Grant was used to supplement the DUI Team by funding officers to saturate the area looking for suspected DUI drivers. Without this grant, the Department's ability to address DUI drivers is limited.

Aside from the DUI enforcement team, the STEP Grant funds DUI checkpoints. These checkpoints are educational, highly visible, and provide a deterrent against impaired driving. The Department's commitment to DUI enforcement is evident in the OTS data rankings. In the study, Costa Mesa had the best ranking for DUI arrests in 2012 (847 arrests) and 2013 (717 arrests) out of 56 cities in the population group. During those years, the Department had a full-time DUI team.

As set forth in the OTS rankings, in 2013, the Costa Mesa Police Department made 717 DUI arrests for the year. With the absence of the DUI team, the Department made 356 DUI arrests in 2014, 356 DUI arrests in 2015, 421 DUI arrests in 2016, and 345 arrests in 2017. Based on the City's data, the Department made 397 DUI arrests in 2018, 461 DUI arrests in 2019, 308 DUI arrests in 2020, and 1,093 DUI arrests in 2021.

With the 2014 addition of driving under the influence of drugs (DUID) provisions to the California Vehicle Code (CVC) (Sections 23152(f) and (g)), we are now able to accurately track the DUID problem in Costa Mesa. In 2014, 37 arrests were made for DUID or combinations of drugs/alcohol and that number nearly doubled in 2015 to 63. Subsequently, there were 75 DUID arrests in 2016, 107 DUID arrests in 2017, 106 DUID arrests in 2018, 65 DUID arrests in 2019, 127 DUID arrests in 2020, and 135 DUID arrests in 2021.

The Police Department submitted applications and received tentative approval for the 2022-23 OTS STEP Grant. The grant will allow the Department to implement the Selective Traffic Enforcement Program (STEP). This program will provide a comprehensive approach to reducing violations, which commonly lead to collisions while maintaining a focus on impaired and suspended/unlicensed drivers. Grant funds will be used to staff sobriety/driver license checkpoints and to staff targeted enforcement operations. In addition, funds will be used to purchase operation related equipment and support additional law enforcement training related to DUI investigations and enforcement activities. The implementation of this training, along with the STEP enforcement operations, will help achieve the overall goal of reducing injury collisions, saving lives, and reducing liability.

The Department's current grant expires on September 30, 2022. The 2022-2023 grant will enable the Police Department to build upon successes achieved to date, while providing new objectives for increasing traffic safety throughout the City. The funding will allow the Department additional resources to combat impaired driving and enforce traffic laws aimed at saving lives. Objectives of the OTS grant include DUI saturation patrols; traffic enforcement operations targeting red light, excessive speed; distracted driving violations; traffic enforcement at high collision intersections; and sobriety/driver license checkpoints.

Some specific project objectives from the Grant Agreement include:

- Conduct four DUI/DL checkpoints.
- Conduct 21 DUI saturation patrols.
- Conduct 17 special traffic enforcement operations targeting red light, excessive speed, and other violations at or near intersections with a disproportionate number of traffic collisions.
- Conduct three special enforcement operations targeting distracted driving violations.
- Conduct two bicycle and pedestrian safety enforcement operations.
- Provide advanced officer training in DUI enforcement to eight officers.

OTS grant funding is based on the federal fiscal year, which begins on October 1, 2022, and ends on September 30, 2023. The Grant Agreement allocates \$265,000, which will be utilized over the federal fiscal year 12-month period. OTS will reimburse the City for approved grant expenditures throughout the grant period.

<u>ALTERNATIVES:</u>

The City Council may elect not to accept the grant; however, the Department would not be able to pursue the specific goals outlined in this report.

FISCAL REVIEW:

Upon acceptance of the 2022-23 OTS STEP Grant, revenue and expense appropriations in the amount of \$265,000 respectively will be established for the grant. The grant period is from October 1, 2022, to September 30, 2023.

LEGAL REVIEW:

The City Attorney's Office has reviewed the 2022 OTS STEP Grant Agreement, proposed resolution, and this report, and has approved them as to form.

The funded strategies may include impaired driving enforcement, enforcement operations focusing on primary crash factors, distracted driving, night-time seat belt enforcement, special enforcement operations encouraging motorcycle safety, enforcement and public awareness in areas with a high number of bicycle and pedestrian crashes, and educational programs. These strategies are designed to earn media attention thus enhancing the overall deterrent effect.

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1. PROBLEM STATEMENT

Fatal Traffic Crashes:

The last year of successfully obtaining ZERO fatalities was in 2012. Since 2015 (8 fatalities), we have had a slight decrease in yearly fatalities. The decrease can be attributed to OTS funding for additional enforcement. We had six fatalities during the calendar year of 2016, five in 2017, six in 2018, five in 2019, and five in 2020. The majority of fatal traffic crashes involved motorcycles and pedestrians. During the course of our fatal traffic crash investigations, the Costa Mesa Police Department observed a variety contributing factors, including driving under the influence of both alcohol and/or drugs and right of way violations involving motorcyclists, bicycles and pedestrians. According to SWITRS (2019), Costa Mesa ranked 34th worst for total fatal and injury crashes out of 59 other cities in our population group.

DUI Traffic Crashes:

In Costa Mesa, DUI continues to be a major problem. In 2015, we had three alcohol-involved fatal traffic crashes. Costa Mesa has always had a serious DUI problem due to numerous ABC establishments located within the city boundaries, a highly traveled freeway terminating in our city, and our city roadways being used for freeway access to two large beach cities, Newport Beach and Huntington Beach. In 2017, we saw a decline in DUI involved fatalities (2) and a rise in DUI arrests (389), attributed to OTS DUI saturation patrols and increased officer education through SFST's and ARIDE programs. Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, no officers were sent for SFST, ARIDE, and DRE training in 2020. Officers new to the Traffic Safety Bureau will attend SFST, ARIDE, and DRE training in the near future. According to SWITRS (2019), Costa Mesa ranked 20th worst for alcohol-involved crashes out of 59 other cities in our population group.

Distracted Drivers:

Nationally, there has been an increase in distracted driving involved traffic crashes, both non-injury, and injury. An OTS Statewide Intercept Opinion Survey revealed that 36.3 percent of Californians stated texting and talking on cellular telephones are the biggest safety concerns on California roadways. Although we are unable to quantify the number of traffic crashes in the City of Costa Mesa related to distracted driving, we believe it is responsible for a major portion of our unsafe speed, rear-end traffic crashes.

DUID Driving:

The problem of driving under the influence while drugged (DUID) continues to rise. Of all drivers killed in motor vehicle crashes, who were tested, 29 percent proved positive for legal and/or illegal drugs. This percentage has been increasing every year since 2006. With the 2014 addition of the DUID law subsections, CVC 23152(f) and CVC 23152(g), we are now able to accurately track the DUID problem in the City of Costa Mesa. In 2017, there was an increase from previous years due to the easy accessibility of drugs, namely marijuana and prescription drugs. Because of the continued training classes offered to officers regarding DUID through OTS grant-funded training, the City of Costa Mesa had 1097 arrests for DUID or Driving under the influence of a combination of alcohol and drugs during 2021.

Motorcyclists:

In the city of Costa Mesa, the number of motorcyclist fatalities has remained consistent over the past five years - 2017 (2), 2018(1), 2019 (2), 2020 (0) and 2021 (1). According to SWITRS (2019), the City of Costa Mesa ranked 11th worst for total motorcycle injury crashes out of 59 other cities in our population group.

Pedestrian & Bicyclists:

Pedestrians and bicyclists are the most vulnerable to injury and death when involved in a motor vehicle traffic crash. High visibility enforcement is a direct contribution to the decline in both bicycle and pedestrian fatal and injury traffic crashes. The Costa Mesa Police Department has investigated numerous pedestrian and bicycle fatal and injury traffic crash over the past five years. Those fatal traffic crash investigations include: three pedestrian fatalities in 2016, one bicyclist and two pedestrian fatalities in 2017. One pedestrian fatality in 2018, two pedestrian fatalities in 2019, two pedestrian and two bicyclist fatalities in 2020, and one pedestrian fatality in 2021.

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Traffic Enforcement Staffing:

Police Department budgets and staffing levels have reduced the number of officers on the street enforcing traffic laws. In the past, the Costa Mesa Police Department was adversely affected by a decrease in sworn personnel. The Traffic Safety Bureau staffing was severely impacted. As of 2022, we are currently at 133 sworn officers of the fully authorized staffing level of 143 sworn officers. Of the 133 sworn officers, three are on long term, injured-on-duty leave with uncertain return to work dates. We currently have ten dedicated Traffic Officers, one Special Events Officer, one Traffic Investigator, and two Traffic Sergeants. As of January 6, 2021, the Costa Mesa Police Department Traffic Safety Bureau implemented a dedicated two officer DUI enforcement team.

3. METHOD OF PROCEDURE

A. Phase 1 – Program Preparation (1st Quarter of Grant Year)

- The department will develop operational plans to implement the "best practice" strategies outlined in the objectives section.
- All training needed to implement the program should be conducted this quarter.
- All grant related purchases needed to implement the program should be made this quarter.
- In order to develop/maintain the "DUI BOLOs," research will be conducted to identify the "worst of
 the worst" repeat DUI offenders with a suspended or revoked license as a result of DUI
 convictions. The Hot Sheets may include the driver's name, last known address, DOB,
 description, current license status, and the number of times suspended or revoked for DUI. DUI
 BOLOs should be updated and distributed to traffic and patrol officers at least monthly.
- Implementation of the STEP grant activities will be accomplished by deploying personnel at high crash locations.
- Media Requirements Issue a press release approved by the OTS PIO announcing the kick-off of the grant by November 15, but no sooner than October 1. The kick-off release must be approved by the OTS PIO and only distributed after the grant is fully signed and executed. If you are unable to meet the November 15 deadline to issue a kick-off press release, communicate reasons to your OTS coordinator and OTS PIO.

B. Phase 2 – Program Operations (Throughout Grant Year)

• The department will work to create media opportunities throughout the grant period to call attention to the innovative program strategies and outcomes.

Media Requirements

- Pre-approval is not required when using any OTS-supplied template for media advisories, press
 releases, social media graphics, videos or posts, or any other OTS-supplied educational material.
 However, copy the OTS PIO at pio@ots.ca.gov and your OTS coordinator when any material is
 distributed to the media and public, such as a press release, educational material, or link to social
 media post. The OTS-supplied kick-off press release templates and any kickoff press releases
 are an exception to this policy and require prior approval before distribution to the media and
 public.
- If an OTS-supplied template, educational material, social media graphic, post or video is substantially changed, the changes shall be sent to the OTS PIO at pio@ots.ca.gov for approval and copy to your OTS Coordinator. Optimum lead time would be 7 days prior to the scheduled release date, but at least 3 business days prior to the scheduled release date for review and approval is appreciated.
- Press releases, social media posts and alerts on platforms such as NextDoor and Nixle reporting
 immediate and time-sensitive grant activities (e.g. enforcement operations, day of event
 highlights or announcements, event invites) are exempt from the OTS PIO approval process. The
 OTS PIO and your Coordinator should still be notified when the grant-related activity is
 happening (e.g. car seat checks, bicycle rodeos, community presentations, DUI checkpoints,
 etc.).
- Enforcement activities such as warrant and probation sweeps, court stings, etc. that are
 embargoed or could impact operations by publicizing in advance are exempt from the PIO
 approval process. However, announcements and results of activities should still be copied to the
 OTS PIO at pio@ots.ca.gov and your Coordinator with embargoed date and time or with
 "INTERNAL ONLY: DO NOT RELEASE" message in subject line of email.
- Any earned or paid media campaigns for TV, radio, digital or social media that are part of a
 specific grant objective, using OTS grant funds, or designed and developed using contractual
 services by a subgrantee, requires prior approval. Please send to the OTS PIO at
 pio@ots.ca.gov for approval and copy your grant coordinator at least 3 business days prior to the
 scheduled release date.
- Social media posts highlighting state or national traffic safety campaigns (Distracted Driving Month, Motorcycle Safety Awareness Month, etc.), enforcement operations (DUI checkpoints, etc.), or any other grant-related activity such as Bicycle rodeos, presentations, or events, are highly encouraged but do not require prior approval.
- Submit a draft or rough-cut of all digital, printed, recorded or video material (brochures, posters, scripts, artwork, trailer graphics, digital graphics, social posts connected to an earned or paid media campaign grant objective) to the OTS PIO at pio@ots.ca.gov and copy your OTS Coordinator for approval prior to the production or duplication.
- Use the following standard language in all press, media, and printed materials, space permitting: Funding for this program was provided by a grant from the California Office of Traffic Safety, through the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration.
- Space permitting, include the OTS logo on all grant-funded print materials, graphics and paid or earned social media campaign grant objective; consult your OTS Coordinator for specifics, format-appropriate logos, or if space does not permit the use of the OTS logo.
- Email the OTS PIO at pio@ots.ca.gov and copy your OTS Coordinator at least 21 days in advance, or when first confirmed, a short description of any significant grant-related traffic safety event or program, particularly events that are highly publicized beforehand with anticipated media coverage so OTS has sufficient notice to arrange for attendance and/or participation in the event. If unable to attend, email the OTS PIO and coordinator brief highlights and/or results, including any media coverage (broadcast, digital, print) of event within 7 days following significant grant-related event or program. Media and program highlights are to be reflected in QPRs.
- Any press releases, work plans, scripts, storyboards, artwork, graphics, videos or any
 educational or informational materials that received PIO approval in a prior grant year needs to
 be resubmitted for approval in the current grant year.
- Contact the OTS PIO or your OTS Coordinator for consultation when changes from any of the above requirements might be warranted.

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C. Phase 3 – Data Collection & Reporting (Throughout Grant Year)

- 1. Prepare and submit invoice claims (due January 30, April 30, July 30, and October 30)
- 2. Prepare and submit Quarterly Performance Reports (QPR) (due January 30, April 30, July 30, and October 30)
 - Collect and report quarterly, appropriate data that supports the progress of goals and objectives.
 - Provide a brief list of activity conducted, procurement of grant-funded items, and significant media activities. Include status of grant-funded personnel, status of contracts, challenges, or special accomplishments.
 - Provide a brief summary of quarterly accomplishments and explanations for objectives not completed or plans for upcoming activities.
 - Collect, analyze and report statistical data relating to the grant goals and objectives.

4. METHOD OF EVALUATION

Using the data compiled during the grant, the Grant Director will complete the "Final Evaluation" section in the fourth/final Quarterly Performance Report (QPR). The Final Evaluation should provide a brief summary of the grant's accomplishments, challenges and significant activities. This narrative should also include whether goals and objectives were met, exceeded, or an explanation of why objectives were not completed.

In accordance with Executive Order 13513, Federal Leadership On Reducing Text Messaging While Driving, and DOT Order 3902.10, Text Messaging While Driving, States are encouraged to adopt and enforce workplace safety policies to decrease crashes caused by distracted driving, including policies to ban text messaging while driving company-owned or rented vehicles, Government-owned, leased or rented vehicles, or privately-owned vehicles when on official Government business or when performing any work on or behalf of the Government. RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends the City Council:

- 1. Hold a Public Hearing regarding the FY 2021-2022 Substantial Amendment to the Annual Action Plan.
- 2. Approve the recommended allocation of \$1,816,742 for the HOME-ARP Allocation Plan, a Substantial Amendment to the FY 2021-2022 Annual Action Plan.
- 3. Adopt Resolution No. 2022-XX in order to:
 - a. Approve the HOME-ARP Allocation Plan, a Substantial Amendment to the 2021-2022 Annual Action Plan.
 - b. Authorize the City Manager, or the City Manager's designee, to submit the 2021-2022 Annual Action Plan Substantial Amendment to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development.
 - c. Designate the City Manager, or the City Manager's designee, as the official representative of the City to administer the programs and to execute and submit all required agreements, certifications, and documents required by HUD, and execute all agreements for the use of funds approved in the 2021-2022 Annual Action Plan Substantial Amendment.
- 4. Authorize revenue and expense appropriations, respectively, each in the amount of \$1,816,742, for the HOME-ARP Allocation Plan.

BACKGROUND:

HOME-ARP Funds

On March 11, 2021, the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (ARP) was signed into law. To address the need for homelessness assistance and supportive services, \$5 billion in federal ARP funds were appropriated and administered through the federal HOME Investment Partnerships Program (HOME). On April 8, 2021, the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) allocated HOME-ARP funds to 651 grantees using the HOME formula established in 24 CFR 92.50 and 92.60. As a recipient of HOME funds, the City of Costa Mesa is eligible to receive a HOME-ARP allocation in the amount of \$1,816,742.

Eligible Activities

HOME-ARP funds can be used to fund four activities that must primarily benefit qualifying individuals and families who are homeless, at risk of homelessness or in other vulnerable populations. These activities are:

- (1) Development and support of affordable housing;
- (2) Provision of supportive services;
- (3) Tenant-based rental assistance (TBRA); and
- (4) Acquisition and development of non-congregate shelter units.

Of these four activities eligible for HOME-ARP funds, the activities that would best serve qualifying individuals and families in Costa Mesa include (1) the development and support of affordable housing and (2) the provision of supportive services.

A TBRA program that uses HOME-ARP funds can only assist qualifying individuals (homeless or at risk of homelessness as specifically defined below). In addition, the City Council has already allocated \$1.6 Million for rental assistance programs using less restrictive funding sources which allow the City to serve a greater proportion of City residents in need. As such, funding TBRA with HOME-ARP funds would not expand the reach of existing rental assistance and HOME-funded TBRA programs currently in operation. Therefore, staff does not recommend using HOME-ARP funds to augment the existing TBRA program.

Regarding non-congregate shelter units, the City of Costa Mesa acquired and developed the 70 bed Bridge Shelter to serve individuals experiencing unsheltered homelessness and is in the expedited process of creating 88 affordable housing units with support services for veterans and seniors through the Homekey program. These approaches provide the appropriate level of resources for those working toward housing stability. Creating non-congregate shelter units using HOME-ARP funds is not recommended at this time.

Lastly, the feedback that was received during the HOME-ARP Allocation Plan outreach supports the determination that activities (1) and (2) listed above are the best use of HOME-ARP funds for the City of Costa Mesa.

Qualifying Populations

The purpose of HOME-ARP funding is to provide homelessness assistance and supportive services to those who are homeless or at risk of becoming homeless. HUD identifies these individuals as part

of "qualifying populations" with very specific definitions for qualifying individuals and families.

ARP defines qualifying individuals or families as those that are (1) homeless, as defined in section 103(a) of the McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act, as amended (42 U.S.C. 11302(a)) ("McKinney-Vento"), (2) at risk of homelessness, as defined in section 401 of McKinney-Vento (e.g. have an annual income below 30% of the median income for the area and do not have permanent housing, for example living in a hotel, , living in the home of another, etc.); (3) fleeing, or attempting to flee domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, stalking, or human trafficking; (4) part of other populations where providing supportive services or assistance would prevent a family's homelessness or would serve those with the greatest risk of housing instability; or (5) veterans and families that include a veteran family member that meet the criteria of (1)-(4) above.

Allocation Plan Required

To receive its HOME-ARP funds, the City must engage in consultation and public participation processes, develop a HOME-ARP allocation plan that meets the HUD requirements, and submit it to HUD as a substantial amendment to the City's Fiscal Year 2021 Annual Action Plan. The HOME-ARP allocation plan must describe how the City intends to distribute HOME-ARP funds, including how it will use these funds to address the needs of HOME-ARP qualifying populations.

HOME-ARP Outreach and Consultation

On March 21, 2022, staff hosted a HOME-ARP consultation meeting with nonprofit service providers and distributed surveys to gather feedback on existing gaps in services for vulnerable populations in Costa Mesa.

On March 31, 2022, staff participated with the Orange County Continuum of Care (CoC) in a consultation meeting to gather feedback on proposed activities for the HOME-ARP Allocation Plan.

On April 5, 2022, a HOME-ARP survey was posted on the City's website to gather additional feedback from the community regarding potential funding priorities.

On May 3, 2022, the City Council held a public hearing after providing a 15-day public comment period for the draft HOME-ARP Allocation plan. Approval of the plan was continued at that time so that staff could provide the City Council with additional information including a comprehensive summary of the various funding sources and rental assistance programs already available to residents in the City. Staff provided a comprehensive overview of Citywide rental assistance programs at the June 21, 2022 City Council meeting.

On July 1, 2022 and on August 21, 2022, the City re-advertised and posted the modified draft HOME-ARP Allocation Plan on the City's website and at City Hall for additional public comment.

Lastly, the City Council will hold a public hearing on September 6, 2022 regarding the submittal of the FY 2021-2022 Substantial Amendment for the HOME-ARP Allocation Plan to HUD.

ANALYSIS:

Community Feedback

Staff received valuable feedback from non-profit service and affordable housing providers and organizations via in-person and virtual outreach meetings, online survey results, and phone and email correspondence. (A summary of the feedback is provided below and within the Allocation Plan itself). In general, feedback indicated a need to focus on:

- Increasing availability/affordability of housing units;
- Mental health and substance abuse supportive services for youth, survivors of domestic violence and individuals experiencing homelessness;
- Supportive and wrap-around services such as transportation, legal services, credit repair and assistance with landlord/tenant relations;
- Case management services;
- Services for seniors, the disabled, and monolingual Spanish speakers; and
- Support for existing programs to ensure continuity of current services.

Recommended HOME-ARP Allocation Plan

The City will receive \$1,816,742 in HOME-ARP funds once the FY 2021-2022 Substantial Amendment for the HOME-ARP Allocation Plan is submitted and approved by HUD. Based on an analysis of housing/community needs, an assessment of current services available to the qualifying populations, and community feedback, staff is recommending funding for two HOME-ARP eligible activities:

- Development and Support of Affordable Housing
- 2. Supportive Services including those defined at 24 CFR 578.53(e)
 - McKinney-Vento Supportive Services
 - Homelessness Prevention Services; and
 - Housing Counseling Services

The Allocation Plan (attached) provides a funding allocation for each of the above-listed activities. Based on the community feedback, staff anticipates a substantial demand for funds for supportive services. However, there is also a clear need for funding to support affordable housing projects as well. As such, staff is recommending that the City Council approve an Allocation Plan that equally divides HOME-ARP funds between supportive services and affordable housing by allocating \$772,116 for each activity. Refer to Table 1 below for the staff recommended HOME-ARP Allocation Budget.

It should be noted that these allocations are estimates and no specific projects are known at this time. A Request for Proposals (RFP) will be issued for both categories of projects. Depending on the

proposals received, HOME-ARP funds may be allocated to either Supportive Services and/or Development of Affordable Rental Housing based on the proposals received. After the City has selected a proposal(s), the City will adjust the amount of funding allocated in either category, not to exceed the total HOME-ARP allocation of \$1,816,742.

Development and Support of Affordable Housing

HOME-ARP funds may be used to acquire, rehabilitate or construct affordable rental housing primarily for occupancy by households of individuals and families that meet the definition of one or more of the qualifying populations under HUD regulations. Eligible HOME-ARP rental housing includes manufactured housing, single room occupancy (SRO) units, and permanent supportive housing. HOME-ARP funds may be used to pay for up to 100% of the following eligible costs associated with the acquisition, development, and operation of HOME-ARP rental units: development hard costs, refinancing, acquisition, related soft costs, relocation costs, costs related to payment of loans, and operating cost assistance. There is a 15-year compliance period. Staff recommends allocating \$772,116 in HOME-ARP funds for the Development and Support of Affordable Housing.

Supportive Services

HOME-ARP funds may be used to provide a broad range of supportive services to qualifying individuals or families as a separate activity or in combination with other HOME-ARP activities. Supportive services include a) services listed in section 401(29) of the McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act ("McKinney-Vento Support Services") b) homeless prevention services and c) housing counseling services. Supportive services may be provided to individuals and families who meet the definition of a qualifying population (i.e. homeless and at risk of homelessness as described earlier in this report). Examples of supportive services that could be eligible include: mental health services, legal services, landlord/tenant liaison services, employment assistance and job training, financial assistance, and other similar services. Staff recommends allocating \$772,116 in HOME-ARP funds for Supportive Services.

Administration

HUD allows the City to allocate up to 15 percent of its HOME-ARP allocation for payment of reasonable administrative and planning costs including program management, coordination, monitoring, and evaluation. Eligible program administration expenditures include program staff salaries and benefits, contract services, legal services, and other costs for good and services required for administering the HOME-ARP program. Based on the City's HOME-ARP grant amount, a maximum of \$272,510 is available for program administration.

Noticing Requirements and Public Comment

As required by HUD, a notice was published in local newspapers on April 17, 2022, inviting the public to review and comment on the draft HOME-ARP Allocation Plan, a Substantial Amendment to the 2021-2022 Annual Action Plan. The comment period began April 18, 2022, and concluded on May 3, 2022. The notice also announced the May 3, 2022 City Council public hearing. No comments were received. A second notice was published in the local newspapers on July 3, 2022, inviting the public to review and comment on the revised draft HOME-ARP Allocation Plan. The comment period began July 3, 2022, and concluded on July 19, 2022 at Noon. No comments were received. A third notice was published in the local newspapers on August 21, 2022, inviting the public to review and comment on the updated revised draft HOME-ARP Allocation Plan. The comment period began August 21, 2022, and concludes on September 6, 2022 at Noon. The notice also announced the September 6, 2022 City Council public hearing. At the time of this report, no comments have been received. If comments are received, they will be forwarded to the Council under separate cover prior to the hearing.

ALTERNATIVES:

The City Council can choose not to fund the proposed activities recommended by staff and allocate HOME-ARP funds to other eligible activities. The City Council can also direct staff to not submit the Allocation Plan; however, if the City does not submit the Allocation Plan, HOME-ARP funds will most likely be returned to the U.S. Treasury.

FISCAL REVIEW:

This action does not have a fiscal impact to the General Fund. Once the HOME-ARP Allocation Plan is approved by HUD, HUD will submit \$1,816,742 in HOME-ARP funds to the programs outlined above and revenue and expense appropriations will be established, respectively in the amount of \$1,816,742 for the HOME-ARP Allocation Plan.

The 2021-2022 Substantial Amendment to the Annual Action Plan has been prepared according to HUD regulations and outlines how the City will utilize HOME-ARP funds to meet the objectives and goals of the federal HOME-ARP program. Staff recommends that the City Council hold a public hearing to obtain public input and adopt the Resolution approving the 2021-2022 Substantial Amendment to the Annual Action Plan.

WHEREAS, the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 authorized the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development ("HUD") to allocate HOME-ARP funds to units of general local government that qualified for an allocation of Home Investment Partnerships Program (HOME) funds in Fiscal Year (FY) 2021; and

WHEREAS, the City of Costa Mesa participates in the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development's ("HUD") Home Investment Partnerships Program (HOME); and

WHEREAS, in order to receive a its HOME-ARP allocation, the City is required to engage in consultation and public participation processes and develop a HOME-ARP allocation plan that meets the requirements established in the HUD CPD Notice 21-10 and submit it to HUD as a substantial amendment to its Fiscal Year 2021 annual action plan; and

WHEREAS, the City's current Consolidated Plan, was adopted on May 19, 2020, and will expire on June 30, 2025; and

WHEREAS, the federal regulations (Title 24 Code of Federal Regulations Part 91) delineate the required content of the Consolidated Plan, including an annual application and expenditure plan for CDBG and HOME funds, known as the Annual Action Plan; and

WHEREAS, the City is eligible to receive \$1,816,742 in HOME-ARP funds, which can be used for development and support of affordable housing, tenant-based rental assistance (TBRA), supportive services and acquisition and development of non-congregate shelter units as set forth in the HOME-ARP Allocation Plan, a Substantial Amendment to the 2021-2022 Annual Action Plan (Exhibit A); and

WHEREAS, the City made the HOME-ARP Allocation Plan, a Substantial Amendment to the 2021-2022 Annual Action Plan available for the required 15-day public review period three times between April 17, 2022 and May 2, 2022; July 3, 2022 and July 18, 2022; and August 21, 2022 and September 5, 2022 with a scheduled Public Hearing on Tuesday, September 6, 2022.

WHEREAS, the City has published a notice of a public hearing for the HOME-ARP Allocation Plan, a Substantial Amendment to the 2021-2022 Annual Action Plan; and

WHEREAS, in the 2021-2022 Substantial Amendment to the Annual Action Plan, the City has considered all public comments which have been received either in writing or at the public hearing.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COSTA MESA HEREBY RESOLVES as follows:

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EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The City of Costa Mesa has been allocated \$1,816,742 of HOME-American Recovery Plan Act (HOME-ARP) funding from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). To receive its HOME-ARP allocation, the City must develop a HOME-ARP Allocation Plan that will become part of the FY 2021-2022 Annual Action Plan by substantial amendment.

To ensure broad input into the HOME-ARP Allocation Plan from stakeholders and the public, the City of Costa Mesa engaged in virtual and in-person consultation with agencies and service providers whose clientele include the HOME-ARP qualifying populations. The City also had direct contact with HUD-required organizations that did not participate in a consultation meeting, solicited feedback from organizations and residents by directing them to a survey link on the City website, had three 15-day public comment periods, and two public hearings.

The needs assessment and gap analysis identified the following needs and gaps that may be addressed using HOME-ARP funds:


- Need/Gap: The February 21, 2022 Point-In-Time (PIT) count summary report revealed a total of 150 unsheltered and 58 sheltered homeless individuals in the City of Costa Mesa.
 - Resolution: HOME-ARP funding of permanent supportive housing units will help to resolve chronic homelessness for our unsheltered homeless population.
- Need/Gap: 12,640 (50.5%) of renter households in Costa Mesa spend 30% or more on housing costs (cost burden) and 6,465 (25.9%) of those households spend 50% or more of their gross income on housing costs (severe cost burden).
 - Resolution: HOME-ARP supportive services for qualifying individuals and families can help reduce the total financial burden for households with high housing costs.
- Need/Gap: A majority (57%) of persons included in the Central Service Planning Area (Central SPA) January 2019 PIT count had mental health or substance use issues. 29% were identified as having a developmental or physical disability and 37% were identified as chronically homeless.
 - Resolution: HOME-ARP supportive services for qualifying individuals (individuals at risk or experiencing homelessness) can help address these issues for individuals where other funding received by the City does not.

To address these needs and gaps, the City of Costa Mesa will utilize HOME-ARP funds for supportive services, development of affordable rental housing, and planning and administration.

CONSULTATION

Summary of the Consultation Process

The City of Costa Mesa engaged in consultation and public participation processes to develop a HOME-ARP allocation plan that meets the requirements established by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) and provided in the City's Citizen Participation Plan. The process was a collaborative effort that included consultation with the local Orange County Continuum of Care, the Orange County Housing Authority, local Cities, and several nonprofit agencies that serve those experiencing homelessness, at risk of homelessness, seniors, victims of domestic violence, and other qualifying population groups. Consultation included a virtual consultation meeting with the Orange County Health Care Agency, Office of Care Coordination (CoC), an in-person meeting with nonprofit service providers, direct email and phone contact, and the distribution of surveys that collected information on service needs among the qualifying population groups.

The City made an effort to have an open consultation process. No agency/service type was knowingly excluded from the process.

Summary of Feedback Received from Consulted Organizations

- There is a lack of mental health and substance abuse supportive services available for youth, survivors of domestic violence and individuals experiencing homelessness.
- Housing first cannot be housing only; supportive and wrap-around services are needed.
- The vacancy rate is very low in Costa Mesa and throughout Orange County. It is estimated to be at less than 2%. There is a lack of availability of housing units.
- Funding programs that are already in motion is a better way to ensure continuity of current services.
- Supportive services such as transportation, legal services, credit repair and assistance with landlord/tenant relations are needed.
- During COVID related school closures there was an increase in gang activity, drug use, and sex trafficking incidents. More case management services are needed to respond.
- Seniors, the disabled and monolingual Spanish speakers are subpopulations that face additional barriers to services.

PUBLIC PARTICIPATION

The City took several steps to obtain community residents' input to develop the HOME-ARP Allocation Plan. Consultation efforts included public meetings with nonprofit service providers and City Council, posted and emailed surveys, and notices. Specifically, for the HOME-ARP Allocation Plan planning process, the City utilized its internet webpage, social media and newspaper notices to inform residents of the opportunities to provide input and review/comment on the draft Allocation Plan. All City Council meetings were noticed in local newspapers of general circulation in both Spanish and English. Additionally, the draft HOME-ARP Allocation Plan was posted on the City's website for public review and comment for three 15-day public comment periods held from April 17, 2022 to May 3, 2022; from July 3, 2022 to July 19, 2022; and August 21, 2022 to September 6, 2022 (see **Attachment 1).** Hard copies of the draft Allocation Plan were available for public review at the public counter at Costa Mesa City Hall 2nd Floor – 77 Fair Drive, Costa Mesa, CA.

NEEDS ASSESSMENT AND GAPS ANALYSIS

The needs assessment and gap analysis must evaluate the 1) size and demographic composition of HOME-ARP qualifying populations, and 2) unmet needs of HOME-ARP qualifying populations.

Size and Demographic Composition of HOME-ARP Qualifying Populations in Costa Mesa

Homeless Population

The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) requires that all Continuum of Care jurisdictions across the nation complete a biennial unsheltered count and an annual sheltered count of all individuals experiencing homelessness in the community on a single point in time during the last ten days of January. The County of Orange was approved by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development to reschedule the 2022 Point in Time (PIT) count to the last 10 days of February due to the impacts of COVID-19. The County of Orange and Orange County Continuum of Care conducted the sheltered count the night of Monday, February 21, 2022, and the unsheltered count started the morning of Tuesday, February 22 through Thursday, February 24. A summary of the results of the 2022 Point in Time count became available on May 11, 2022. The summary information (count comparisons between 2019 and 2022) included in this City of Costa Mesa HOME-ARP Allocation Plan is from the 2022 Point in Time (PIT) summary; The detailed information is from the 2019 PIT count report that provides information about the count that took place from January 22, 2019 to January 24, 2019.

The February 2022 PIT count revealed a total of 208 homeless individuals in the City of Costa Mesa. Among the 208 individuals, 58 were sheltered and 150 were unsheltered. This is a 20% decrease in the number of unsheltered individuals compared the January 2019 PIT count that identified 6 sheltered and 187 unsheltered. The change is attributed to the creation of the temporary 50-bed Bridge Shelter in April 2019 followed by the completion of the 72-bed permanent Bridge Shelter that was opened in April of 2021 on Airway Avenue in Costa Mesa.

The specific demographic composition data was not broken down by City in the 2019 Orange County Point in Time count, however, the data was broken down into three Service Planning Areas – North, Central and South. The City of Costa Mesa is part of the Central Service Planning Area (Central SPA) which includes 9 cities and a county unincorporated area. In the Central SPA, 3,332 homeless individuals were counted. Of

that total, 72% were White, 11% were Black or African American, 8% were Multiple Races or Other and 5% were Asian. Additionally, 37% of all persons in the Central SPA count reported being of Hispanic or Latino ethnicity. The 2022 PIT count summary shows that the total number of unsheltered and sheltered individuals experiencing homelessness in Orange County has gone down by 18.55% since the 2019 PIT count.

At Risk of Homelessness

The term "at risk of homelessness", as defined in section 401(1) of the McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act (42 U.S.C. 11360(1)); means, with respect to an individual or family, that the individual or family:

has income below 30 percent of median income for the geographic area;

- has insufficient resources immediately available to attain housing stability; and
 - has moved frequently because of economic reasons;
 - o is living in the home of another because of economic hardship;
 - has been notified that their right to occupy their current housing or living situation will be terminated;
 - lives in a hotel or motel;
 - lives in severely overcrowded housing;
 - is exiting an institution; or
 - otherwise lives in housing that has characteristics associated with instability and an increased risk of homelessness.

According to the 2014-2018 American Community Survey (ACS), 6,185 renter households in Costa Mesa have household incomes below 30% of the Area Median Income (AMI) and only 875 rental units in Costa Mesa are affordable for households at that income level. This leaves over 5,310 very-low income households in Costa Mesa at risk of homelessness as defined above.

Fleeing, or Attempting to Flee, Domestic Violence, Dating Violence, Sexual Violence, Sexual assault, Stalking or Human Trafficking

The 2019 PIT count identified 140 unsheltered adult and 94 sheltered adult survivors of domestic violence in the Central Service Planning Area of Orange County. Providers of services to survivors of domestic violence indicate the number of individuals in need of shelter is likely undercounted as isolation and physical distancing mandates during the Coronavirus pandemic resulted in increased domestic violence concerns while limiting potential flight from unsafe living situations. Demographic information for this qualifying population is confidential.

OTHER POPULATIONS

Other populations, as defined by HOME-ARP, include those who:

- 1. Are currently housed and at risk of repeat homelessness;
- 2. Have incomes below 30% AMI and are experiencing severe housing cost burden; and
- 3. Otherwise meet the definition of at risk of homelessness and have incomes between 30% and 50% AMI.

The Continuum of Care 2019 PIT narrative indicates that 402 or 40.81% of unsheltered individuals reported experiencing homelessness for the first time in the last 12 months. Therefore, almost 60% of the 985 unsheltered individuals surveyed had experienced homelessness previously and would be at a higher risk for repeat homelessness.

The 2014-2018 HUD Comprehensive Housing Affordability Strategy (CHAS) data table indicates that 3,585 renters in Costa Mesa are experiencing severe housing cost burden and 3,505 renters have incomes between 30% and 50% AMI and may be considered eligible under "other populations" if they otherwise meet the definition of at risk homelessness.

Unmet Housing and Service Needs of Qualifying Populations

The greatest unmet housing needs of qualifying populations are:

- Permanent rental housing that is affordable to qualifying and other populations;
 and
- Permanent supportive rental housing that coordinates specialized services with housing that is affordable to qualifying and other populations

The greatest unmet service needs of qualifying populations, including sheltered and unsheltered homeless populations, currently housed populations at risk of homelessness, other families requiring services or assistance to prevent homelessness,

and those at greatest risk of housing instability or in unstable housing situations are:

- Mental health treatment
- Substance abuse treatment
- Transportation
- Legal Services
- Employment assistance and job training
- Life skills
- Case management
- Outpatient health services
- Outreach services
- Credit repair
- Landlord-tenant liaison services
- Housing search and counseling assistance
- Services for special populations
- Financial assistance to secure stable housing, such as rental application fees, security and utility deposits, and first month's rent

Current Resources Available to Assist Qualifying Populations

As outlined in the 2020-2024 Consolidated Plan, the City has a well-developed strategy to address homelessness in the community. This strategy includes outreach and assessment services for homeless and chronic homeless individuals. These programs will help households, especially extremely low-income households, maximize the amount of income they have available for housing. Program staff will attempt to link individuals to appropriate housing, support services, and public assistance programs (e.g., VA benefits, SSI). To undertake this effort, the City partners with local nonprofit service providers and community-based volunteers. Based on assessments, individuals or households are referred to appropriate housing/service providers. City staff will coordinate the delivery of services and housing with providers to reduce the number of homeless individuals in the community. Both HUD and City funds will be used to carry out these activities, including emergency shelter and rapid rehousing.

Emergency Shelters

According to the 2021 Orange County Housing Inventory Count (HIC), the following emergency shelters are available to assist qualifying populations in the City of Costa Mesa:

The City of Costa Mesa opened an emergency Bridge Shelter at a temporary location in April 2019 with 50 beds, while constructing a permanent shelter location with 72 beds that opened in April 2021. The permanent Bridge Shelter was built in coordination with the neighboring City of Newport Beach who made a one-time payment of \$1.4 million in capital costs as well as \$200,000 in furniture, fixtures, and equipment for the site. Additionally, Newport Beach will provide \$1 million annually for 20 set-aside beds. The Bridge Shelter assists persons experiencing homelessness with temporary housing along with a variety of programs including: Collaborative Case Management; Housing Related Support Services (including Coordinated Entry System housing assignments); Housing Search Assistance (linking clients to rental assistance programs and other general housing services); Legal Services; Basic Needs (including food, clothing, and housing/emergency services); Social Services; and Transportation. The permanent Bridge Shelter publishes bi-weekly reports in which they regularly assist approximately 60 to 110+ persons over a two-week span.

Supportive Services

The City recognizes certain segments of the population require additional assistance to secure decent housing and supportive services. Special needs groups in Costa Mesa include: seniors, persons with disabilities (including developmental disabilities), persons at-risk of experiencing homelessness or experiencing homelessness, and low-income families (including large households and female-headed households). Through the annual action plan process for the CDBG program, the City evaluates the needs of various special needs groups and allocates CDBG Public Service dollars accordingly. The City will continue to expend available CDBG funds in a manner that addresses local needs and augments the regional continuum of care system in Orange County.

Approximately \$1,000,000 in General Fund and Housing Authority (former Redevelopment Agency) resources will be allocated to provide direct outreach services for chronic and situational homeless. Services include engagement, assessment, and linkages to appropriate services and housing. City-paid social workers and community volunteers will provide services.

Rental Housing Assistance

The City continues to participate in the Orange County Housing Authority's (OCHA) Housing Choice Vouchers program to provide rent subsidies to very low-income

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households provided funding is available. Costa Mesa does not own or manage public housing. It is anticipated that OCHA will continue to provide rental assistance to approximately 591 Costa Mesa renter households (265 disabled persons, 401 elderly persons, 49 families, 74 homeless at admission and 32 veterans). 89 people are currently on the waitlist.

The City also began offering a Tenant Based Rental Assistance (**TBRA**) program in 2020. The program focus is on families with children at risk of homelessness or exiting temporary or bridge shelter housing. This program assists low-income residents with short-term rental assistance to make renting affordable. The City's TBRA program began as a pilot program in response to the COVID-19 pandemic and has been reevaluated to determine what changes, if any, could be made to increase the number of severely cost burdened Costa Mesa residents receiving this much needed assistance. The result of the evaluation of the TBRA program, as well as a review of all other emergency rental assistance programs funded through the City, was to request City Council approval at the regular City Council Meeting on June 21, 2022 to lift any requirements that were not mandatory per HUD regulations. The end result was an approval from City Council to increase the pool of eligible residents for these rental assistance programs by removing unnecessary barriers or limits beyond HUD required limits (i.e. income limits, length of assistance) to the assistance. The City will continue to evaluate, make necessary modifications and offer rental housing assistance programs based on the availability of funding.

CDBG and CDBG-CV funding is allocated for short-term emergency assistance such as rapid rehousing, homelessness prevention and support services. The City currently funds three local nonprofit organizations with CDBG-CV funds to provide assistance to households at-risk of homelessness. As with the TBRA program, the eligibility requirements of the CDBG-CV funded rental assistance programs were re-evaluated and requirements that were not mandatory per HUD regulations were removed from the eligibility determinations. The income limit was raised from 50% AMI to 80% AMI as HUD regulations allow and the limit on rental assistance per household was removed.

The recent changes to Costa Mesa rental assistance programs, approved by City Council on June 21, 2022, will increase the resources available to Costa Mesa residents facing a severe cost burden (spending 50% or more of their income on housing costs) who might not have been eligible under the previous program guidelines. The City has increased its outreach to residents through a variety of communications in both Spanish and English to increase awareness about these programs.

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Gaps within the Current Shelter and Housing Inventory and Service Delivery System

Shelter Gap

According to the 2019 Orange County Point-In-Time count, there were 193 individuals experiencing homelessness in the City of Costa Mesa. As a result, the City opened up a temporary shelter with 50 beds available. In 2021, the City closed its temporary shelter and opened its 72 bed permanent Bridge Shelter in the City of Costa Mesa. The resulting gap as illustrated in Table 4 is an estimated need for 181 (reduced to 74 as of the 2022 Point-In-Time Count) additional shelter beds. However, on the night of the 2019 Point-In-Time count, 211 Emergency Shelter and Transitional Housing beds remained vacant in Orange County's Central SPA, which points to possible gaps in the service delivery system. Comparable information is not yet available from the 2022 PIT count. The City continues to work with the County, neighboring Cities and homeless service providers to close the gaps in the service delivery system and decrease the number of unsheltered homeless in Costa Mesa and Orange County.

Tenant-Based Rental Assistance Gap

The City of Costa Mesa provided \$300,000 in HOME funds for a Pilot TBRA program in 2020 and identified Program Income received through the HOME Program as a future source of funding for TBRA in the 2020-2024 Consolidated Plan. As of the current date, approximately 9% of the funds have provided assistance to three Costa Mesa families. The City has identified that changes to the program, including expanded eligibility criteria for the TBRA program and increased advertising and awareness of the program, are needed to increase the number of Costa Mesa residents participating in the program.

Consultation feedback and information available about the vacancy rate in the City of Costa Mesa (2.8% according to the 2020 ACS), points to a profound gap in the available rental units in the City. With the revised criteria to the TBRA program, the City will be able to direct rental assistance to low income, housing-cost burdened Costa Mesa residents with a current lease in the City and increase the number of households with affordable housing costs (spending no more than 30% of total household income on housing costs).

The City continues to participate in the Orange County Housing Authority's (OCHA) Housing Choice Vouchers program to provide rent subsidies to very low-income households provided funding is available. Costa Mesa does not own or manage public housing. It is anticipated that OCHA will continue to provide rental assistance to

approximately 591 Costa Mesa renter households (265 disabled persons, 401 elderly persons, 49 families, 74 homeless at admission and 32 veterans). 89 people are currently on the waitlist.

Affordable and Permanent Supportive Rental Housing Gap

As identified in Table 5 in this document, there is a need for 10,915 affordable units in the City of Costa Mesa, and only 1,290 units that meet this description. Of the 10,915 that are needed, 5,310 units are needed for households with incomes at or below 30% of the Orange County Area Median Income (AMI) and 4,315 units are need for households with incomes between 30% and 50% AMI.

Of the 89 people currently on the waitlist for Housing Choice Vouchers through the Orange County Housing Authority (OCHA), there are 30 disabled persons, 34 elderly persons and 16 currently homeless. These populations have a higher success rate in maintaining housing with supportive services. According to The Corporation for Supportive Housing (CSH) www.csh.org, the state of California needs approximately 30,000 permanent supportive housing units to resolve chronic homelessness. If you divide that number by the total population of California and then multiply it by the population of Costa Mesa, the gap for permanent supportive housing in Costa Mesa equals 845 units.

Service Delivery System Gap

Consultation with organizations having experience with providing services to the qualifying populations revealed service delivery system gaps including case management, connecting individuals with employment opportunities with sufficient income to afford housing, lack of transportation, move-in assistance, and mental health and substance abuse treatment availability. Service providers also identified that there was a lack of availability of funding for capacity building for their organizations.

Characteristics of Housing Associated with Instability and an Increased Risk of Homelessness

At Greatest Risk of Housing Instability is defined as household who meets either paragraph below:

Has annual income that is less than or equal to 30% of the area median income, as determined by HUD and is experiencing severe cost burden (i.e., is paying more than 50% of monthly household income toward housing costs);

Has annual income that is less than or equal to 50% of the area median income, as

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determined by HUD AND meets one of the following conditions from paragraph iii of the "At risk of homelessness" definition established at 24 CFR 91.5

- Has moved because of economic reasons two or more times during the 60 days immediately preceding the application for homelessness prevention assistance
- Is living in the home of another because of economic hardship
- Has been notified in writing that their right to occupy their current housing or living situation will be terminated within 21 days after the date of application for assistance
- Lives in a hotel or motel and the cost of the hotel or motel stay is not paid by charitable organizations or by Federal, State or local government programs for low-income individuals
- Lives in a single-room occupancy or efficiency apartment unit in which there
 reside more than two persons or lives in a larger housing unit in which there
 reside more than 1.5 persons reside per room, as defined by the U.S. Census
 Bureau
- Is exiting a publicly funded institution, or system of care (such as a health-care facility, a mental health facility, foster care or other youth facility, or correction program or institution; or
- Otherwise lives in housing that has characteristics associated with instability and an increased risk of homelessness, as identified in the recipient's approved consolidated plan

Priority Needs for Qualifying Populations

The analysis of the 2019 Point in Time count, the 2022 Point in Time count summary, CHAS data, ACS data, and consultation with various agencies identified the priority needs for qualifying populations in Costa Mesa as:

- Development of affordable housing, including permanent supportive housing; and
- Housing-related supportive services for qualifying populations

How the level of need and gaps in its shelter and housing inventory and service delivery systems were determined

The City of Costa Mesa analyzed several data sources to determine the needs and gaps in the shelter and housing inventory and service delivery systems. First, city-level data was gleaned from the 2019 Orange County Point in Time Count and then the 2014-2018 American Community Survey (ACS) and the 2014-2018 Comprehensive

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Housing Affordability Strategy (CHAS). The Costa Mesa 2020-2024 Consolidated Plan, Regional Housing Needs Allocation (RHNA), 2022 Costa Mesa Housing Element and 2020-2024 Orange County Analysis of Impediments were also reviewed for data to contribute to the needs assessment and gaps analysis for the HOME-ARP Allocation Plan.

Current services provided by the City of Costa Mesa and in collaboration with the County of Orange (OCHA) for the qualifying populations were analyzed and feedback obtained from a virtual meeting, in-person meeting, public hearings and comment period, and completed surveys all were included in the analysis to determine the level of need and gaps in shelter and housing inventory and service delivery systems in Costa Mesa.

PROPOSED HOME-ARP ACTIVITIES

Method for Soliciting Applications for Funding and/or Selecting Developers, Service Providers, Subrecipients and/or Contractors

The City of Costa Mesa (City) will be soliciting applications for funding and/or selecting developers, service providers, subrecipients and/or contractors by issuing a Request for Proposals (RFP) for the development and support of affordable housing and/or the provision of supportive services, either as a separate activity or in combination with other HOME-ARP activities.

The Request for Proposals will be announced through notices to the following parties:

- Current and past CDBG Subrecipients
- Interested Developers and Nonprofit Organizations
- 2-1-1 OC
- Public Notice in the local Newspaper
- Published on www.Planetbids.com

A qualified developer, service provider, subrecipient and/or contractor (Applicant) shall complete and submit the Proposal for HOME-ARP funds and prepare all required attachments and exhibits. After the deadline for the RFP, the Development Services staff shall review the proposal(s) to determine that the minimum program and RFP requirements are met (minimum threshold review) and the proposal(s) is eligible under HUD CPD Notice 21-10. Proposals that do not meet the minimum threshold review will be considered non-responsive. If the proposal(s) meets the minimum threshold review, Development Services and Homeless Services staff will form a Review Panel.

Using scoring and selection criteria provided in the RFP, the Review Panel shall determine whether the proposal(s) is recommended for approval.

Before any HOME-ARP funds are committed to an affordable housing project, the project will be evaluated to determine the amount of HOME-ARP capital subsidy and operating cost assistance necessary to provide quality affordable housing that meets the requirements of HUD CDP Notice 21-10 and is financially viable throughout the minimum 15-year HOME-ARP compliance period.

The City will not restrict the eligibility/availability of proposals that may be submitted to the City under the RFP that will be issued to solicit applications for funding and/or selecting developers, service providers, subrecipients and/or contractors for the use of HOME-ARP program funds. The City cannot anticipate if proposals will be submitted for eligible projects under Supportive Services or for the Development of Affordable Rental Housing category because the solicitation is going to be available for either type of project. The City also does not want to limit the possibility of proposals for either eligible activity. Therefore, HOME-ARP funds may be allocated to either Supportive Services and/or Development of Affordable Rental Housing based on proposals that the City receives in response to the RFP solicitation process. After the City has selected a proposal(s), the City will adjust the amount of funding allocated in either category, not to exceed the total HOME-ARP allocation or an amount that would trigger a substantial amendment per the City's Citizen Participation Plan or the HUD CDP 21-10 Notice.

The City of Costa Mesa will not directly administer HOME-ARP activities beyond program administration and planning and no subrecipients or contractors are responsible for program administration and planning on behalf of the City.

Rationale for Uses of HOME-ARP Funding

The vacancy rate of rental units in the City of Costa Mesa according to the 2018 ACS is 2.8%. The actual vacancy rate in 2022 has been suggested to be closer to 1.8%. The number of units available, the high cost of rent and the volume of cost burdened and severely cost burdened renters is a prime indicator for the use of HOME-ARP funds for the development of affordable rental housing.

The City's homeless strategy is based on the proposition that it is less expensive and disruptive for a household to remain housed in their existing home than to be rehoused. To this end, the City focuses its resources on agencies that provide various safety-net services to prevent households from becoming homeless. Although the City already supports programs that provide supportive services to the HOME-ARP qualifying populations, the gap and needs analysis provided in this document reveal the need for additional support services to increase the opportunity and stability for low-income individuals to obtain and maintain housing.

HOME-ARP PRODUCTION HOUSING GOALS

Affordable Rental Housing Production Estimate and Goals

The estimated number of affordable rental housing units that will be produced or supported with the City's HOME-ARP allocation cannot be calculated until after the RFP process is completed. The number will depend on the number of proposed projects received and the required funding to complete any or all of those projects. It will also depend on the type of proposals received since our request will be for both Affordable Housing projects as well as Supportive Services projects.

California's Regional Housing Needs Assessment (RHNA) is the basis for determining future housing need by income category, within the state and is based on growth in population, households, and employment. The City of Costa Mesa's RHNA allocation is divided among four income categories which are benchmarked on the County of Orange's median income for a family of four. Costa Mesa's RHNA Allocation for the 2021-2029 Planning Period for Very Low Income 0-50% MFI is 2,919 units and Low Income 51-80% MFI 1,794 units. The City's goal is to make as much progress toward the City's RHNA requirement as possible with the HOME-ARP funding that is available.

PREFERENCES

The City does not intend to give preference to one or more qualifying populations or a subpopulation within one or more qualifying populations for any eligible activity or project.

HOME-ARP REFINANCING GUIDELINES

The City of Costa Mesa will not utilize HOME-ARP funds for refinancing of properties that may be rehabilitated with HOME-ARP funds.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the City of Costa Mesa City Council will hold a public comment period and public hearing for the HOME-ARP Allocation Plan, a Substantial Amendment to the 2021-2022 Annual Action Plan, in compliance with federal regulations (24 CFR 91).

On March 11, 2021, the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (ARP) was signed into law and allocated federal ARP funds to local cities through the HOME Investment Partnerships Program (HOME). As a recipient of HOME funds, the City of Costa Mesa is eligible to receive a HOME-ARP allocation in the amount of \$1,816,742. To receive its HOME-ARP funds, the City must develop a HOME-ARP Allocation Plan and submit a HOME-ARP Allocation Plan to HUD as a substantial amendment to the City's previously approved Fiscal Year 2021-2022 Annual Action Plan. The HOME-ARP Allocation Plan describes how the City intends to distribute HOME-ARP funds to address the needs of qualifying populations. The City has prepared a HOME-ARP Allocation Plan, a Substantial Amendment to its 2021-2022 Annual Action Plan, which is now available for public review. The Allocation Plan proposes the use of HOME-ARP funds for the following: Proposed HOME-ARP Activity

- Supportive Services for persons at-risk and/or experiencing homelessness
- Development of Affordable Housing
- Program administration

15-Day Public Comment Period

The City is required to make a draft of the HOME-ARP Allocation Plan available for public review for 15 days. The City previously held a 15-day public comment period from April 18, 2022 to May 3, 2022 prior to the May 3, 2022 City Council Meeting and Public Hearing. A second 15-day public comment period was held from July 3, 2022 to July 19, 2022. No comments were received. The draft HOME-ARP Allocation Plan is available for public review again from August 21, 2022 to September 6, 2022 at the public counter at Costa Mesa City Hall 2nd Floor – 77 Fair Drive, Costa Mesa, CA. City Hall is open Monday through Thursday and alternating Fridays, 8 AM to 5 PM. The draft is also posted on the City's website: https://www.costamesaca.gov/city-hall/city-departments/development-services/housing-and-community-development. Written comments regarding the Allocation Plan must be submitted to the attention of Mikelle Daily at Costa Mesa City Hall, 77 Fair Drive, Costa Mesa, CA 92626 or by email to https://www.costamesaca.gov. All written comments must be received by the City no later than 12 PM September 6, 2022.







What is your organization's geographic service area? (i.e. Orange County, City of Costa Mesa, Zip Code, Neighborhood)







"We need permanent supportive housing."

"Please consider more housing support – it's not enough to have more shelter beds without housing. More shelter beds = more bottleneck in the system without permanent housing. Additionally, support of services in housing that promote economic mobility and flow through housing can ensure we can serve more families."

"Get as many people involved as possible. Make sure that all are involved as more than just the available Home-Arp funds will be needed."

"Costa Mesa has a great Network of businesses, City, Nonprofits who work in collaboration to help end homelessness. The big challenge is the lack of affordable units, robust mental health support and affordable addition, detox and recovery units."

"Mental Health law changes around mandatory 30 or 60 day hold must change to help those that cannot see they need help and medication."

"I will be reaching out to city hall tomorrow, I am in desperate need of assistance. I was unrightfully terminated for a job that I was employed with for 9 days, and I feel I was discriminated due to my disability. I applied for unemployment and I was denied benefits because my previous employer said that I quit voluntarily and has misconduct. I filed an appeal and mailed submitted numerous documents to the Appeal Board, but I have not heard anything back from EDD. I have not been able to cover my portion of rent and owe almost \$10,000. The leasing office helped me apply for the CA Covid Rent Relief in Febuary, and I call them twice a week and they are stating that my claim is expidited but I have not gotten any response back from my case manager. I am now recieving food stamps and have almost gone through all of my savings over the past three months. I desprately need your help to obtain rental assistance because I am newly diagnosed with bi-polar disorder and this situation is causing me major distress. I look forward to talking with you."

RECOMMENDATION:

- 1. Authorize the City Manager and City Clerk to execute the Subrecipient Agreement between the City of Costa Mesa and the County of Orange to receive grant funds in the amount of \$100,000 to support shelter and support services for people experiencing homelessness.
- 2. Upon approval, authorize revenue and expense allocations in the amount of \$100,000 respectively, in County of Orange grant funds to support shelter and support services for people experiencing homelessness.
- 3. Authorize the City Manager and City Clerk to execute a Professional Services Agreement with Trellis International in a not to exceed amount of \$70,000.

BACKGROUND:

On March 11, 2021, the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) was passed by Congress and signed into law. Enacted as a component of ARPA, the State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds (SLFRF) Program made available \$350 billion in emergency funding to state, local, territorial, and Tribal governments for revenue replacement, among other things, to provide government services. As part of this allocation process, the County of Orange (County) was awarded a total of \$616.8 million in SLFRF funds.

On May 24, 2022, the Orange County Board of Supervisors authorized the allocation of \$5 million in SLFRF funds to be used to provide grant moneys to organizations within the Fifth District to support temporary shelter and support services for people experiencing homelessness.

On August 1, 2022, the City of Costa Mesa (City) submitted a letter to Orange County Board of Supervisors, Supervisor Bartlett and the County of Orange requesting \$100,000 in SLFRF funds to

purchase furniture, fixtures, and equipment for the Bridge Shelter, and augmentation of supportive services for Shelter guests participating in the Innovative Street Outreach and Life Skills Training Program.

ANALYSIS:

Following notification from the County regarding the availability of funding for emergency shelters located in the Fifth District, the City collaborated with the Bridge Shelter operator, Mercy House; the commercial kitchen operator, Bracken's Kitchen; and a supportive services provider, Trellis, to develop a plan for said funds. Below is a summary of items and activities included in the City's request for funding and approved by the County.

Shelter Facility and Operational Enhancements (\$30,000):

Facility and operational enhancements include:

- Shelter supplies for storage management
- Computer lab equipment and copier providing staff the ability to scan documents into HMIS for housing placement services and coordination
- Recreational games and outdoor activities, including supplies needed to implement a community garden
- Tablets to improve the level of client data collected and reported into HMIS
- Kitchen supplies, equipment, and appliances needed by Bracken's Kitchen to more efficiently operate the Bridge Shelter Commercial Kitchen

Shelter Services Augmentations in Employment/Housing (\$70,000):

On December 18, 2020, the City released RFP-21-05 for Homeless Prevention and Street Outreach Services, and Food Assistance Programs. On March 16, 2021, City Council approved a professional services agreement with Trellis (\$90,382) for Innovative Street Outreach and Life Skills Training. This program, also known as the Back to Work Program, is a transitional employment program serving both sheltered and unsheltered homeless people. Individuals enrolled in the Back to Work Program are part of the Community Impact Team (CIT), which undertakes various community-based projects throughout Costa Mesa. The Back to Work Program is in need of additional funding for projects that include ongoing programmatic supplies (e.g. handy tools, trash bags, etc.), the provision of participant incentives proven to bolster self-esteem and hope for the future, as well as staff costs to administer the program. Staff is recommending that City Council authorize the City Manager and City Clerk to execute a professional services agreement with Trellis using the County of Orange grant funds to continue the administration of the Back to Work Program.

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ALTERNATIVES:

Should the City Council choose not to authorize the execution of the Subrecipient Agreement with the County, the \$100,000 in SLFRF funds will be reallocated to another shelter located in the Fifth District.

FISCAL REVIEW:

Approval of this item will authorize revenue and expense allocations in the amount of \$100,000 respectively, for County of Orange grant funds to benefit the Bridge Shelter.

LEGAL REVIEW:

The City Attorney's Office has reviewed this report and approved as to form.

CITY COUNCIL GOALS AND PRIORITIES:

This item supports the following City Council Goal:

Strengthen the Public's Safety and Improve the Quality of Life

CONCLUSION:

Staff recommends the City Council:

- 1. Authorize the City Manager and City Clerk to execute the Subrecipient Agreement between the City of Costa Mesa and the County of Orange to receive grant funds in the amount of \$100,000 to support temporary shelter and support services for people experiencing homelessness.
- 2. Upon approval, authorize revenue and expense allocations in the amount of \$100,000 respectively, in County of Orange grant funds to support temporary shelter and support services for people experiencing homelessness.
- 3. Authorize the City Manager and City Clerk to execute a Professional Services Agreement with Trellis International in a not to exceed amount of \$70,000.

ATTACHMENT 1

SUBRECIPIENT AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE COUNTY OF ORANGE AND CITY OF COSTA MESA FOR AMERICAN RESCUE PLAN ACT FUNDING

This Subrecipient Agreement (the "Agreement") is made and entered into by and between the County of Orange, a political subdivision of the State of California, hereinafter referred to as "County," and the City of Costa Mesa, a California municipal corporation, hereafter referred to as "Subrecipient," with the County and Subrecipient referred to as "Party," or collectively as "Parties."

WHEREAS, on February 26, 2020, the County Health Officer declared a local health emergency based on an imminent and proximate threat to public health from the introduction of a novel coronavirus (named "COVID-19") in Orange County (the "COVID-19 Emergency"); and

WHEREAS, on March 2, 2020, the Board of Supervisors adopted Resolution No. 2020-11 ratifying the local health emergency declared by the County's Health Officer; and

WHEREAS, on March 4, 2020, the Governor of the State of California declared a State of Emergency to exist in California because of the threat of COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, on March 13, 2020, the President of the United States issued a Proclamation on Declaring a National Emergency Concerning the COVID-19 Outbreak; and

WHEREAS, the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) was passed by Congress and signed into law by the President of the United States on March 11, 2021; and

WHEREAS, under the State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds (SLFRF) program, enacted as part of (ARPA), more than \$350 billion in emergency funding was distributed to state, local, territorial, and Tribal governments with the County receiving a total of \$616.8 million in two equal allocations of SLFRF funds; and

WHEREAS, the ARPA provides that SLFRF funds may be used for revenue replacement for the provision of government services, COVID-19 expenditures or negative economic impacts of COVID-19, premium pay for essential workers, and investments in water, sewer, and broadband infrastructure for the State or local government; and were incurred during the period that begins on March 3, 2021, and ends on December 30, 2024; and

WHEREAS, on January 6, 2022, the United States Department of Treasury released its Final Rule for the SLFRF program, which among other things, authorizes State and local government recipients to use SLFRF funds to replace lost public sector revenue and use such funding to provide government services up to the amount of revenue loss due to the pandemic; and

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WHEREAS, on May 24, 2022, the Orange County Board of Supervisors authorized the allocation of \$5,000,000 in SLFRF funds to be used, among other things, to provide grant moneys to organizations within the Fifth District to support temporary shelter and support services for people experiencing homelessness; and

WHEREAS, Subrecipient has requested funding from the County for the onetime costs of shelter facility enhancements, such as computer equipment, and transitional employment services for those experiencing or at risk of experiencing homelessness; and

WHEREAS, in order to assist Subrecipient in the provision of government services, the Parties have agreed that the County shall transfer the Grant Amount described herein to Subrecipient.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Parties mutually agree as follows:

1. TERM OF AGREEMENT. The term of this Agreement begins on the date when fully executed by the Parties, and terminates on December 31, 2022, or when all the Parties' obligations under this Agreement are fully satisfied, whichever occurs earlier.

2. USE OF GRANT AMOUNT.

a. The grant funds provided are federal funds and subject to the Single Audit Act of 1984. The following information is provided in accordance with the Single Audit Act.

b. Subrecipient shall use Grant Amount provided under this Agreement to pay for the one-time costs of shelter facility enhancements and transitional employment services for those experiencing or at risk of experiencing homelessness.

- c. Indirect costs may not exceed 10% of the modified total direct costs per 2 CFR section 200.68 or the federally approved indirect cost rate, if applicable.
- d. Subrecipient must utilize the Grant Amount in accordance with all Federal and State laws, including but not limited to the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (ARPA), codified at 42 U.S.C. § 802, et seq., and all applicable regulations and guidelines implementing ARPA, including the regulations issued by the Department of Treasury at 31 CFR Part 35 regarding costs that are payable from SLFRF Funds.

3. PAYMENT OF GRANT AMOUNT

- a. The County will issue a one-time payment to the Subrecipient of the Grant Amount set forth in Paragraph 2.a within 10 business days of the full execution of this Agreement. All of Subrecipient's expenditures of the Grant Amount must be for costs as described in Paragraph 2b of this Agreement.
- b. It is understood that the County makes no commitment to fund this Agreement beyond the terms set forth herein.
- c. If Subrecipient has not spent any portion of the Grant Amount it has received under this Agreement to cover Eligible Expenses by December 31, 2022, Subrecipient shall return to the County by January 30, 2023 the amount remaining unspent as of December 31, 2022.
- 4. STATUTES AND REGULATIONS APPLICABLE TO GRANT. Subrecipient must comply with all applicable requirements of State, Federal, and County of Orange laws, executive orders, regulations, program and administrative requirements, policies and any other requirements governing this Agreement. Subrecipient must comply with applicable State and Federal laws and regulations pertaining to labor, wages, hours, and other conditions of employment. Subrecipient must comply with new, amended, or revised laws, regulations, and/or procedures that apply to the performance of this Agreement. These requirements include, but are not limited to:
 - a. Office of Management and Budget (OMB) Guidance. Subrecipient must comply with the Uniform Administrative Requirements, Cost Principles and Audit Requirements for Federal Awards per 2 CFR Part 200 (the "Uniform Guidance"), including the procurement standards set forth in 2 CFR 200.318 through 2 CFR 200.327 when using the Grant Amount to procure goods and services.
 - b. <u>Single Audit Act</u>. Since Federal funds are used in the performance of this Agreement, Subrecipient must, as applicable, adhere to the rules and regulations of the Single Audit Act (31 USC Sec. 7501 et seq.), OMB Circular

A-133 and any administrative regulation or field memoranda implementing the Act.

- c. <u>Political Activity Prohibited</u>. None of the funds, materials, property or services provided directly or indirectly under this Agreement may be used for any partisan political activity, or to further the election or defeat of any candidate for public office. Funds provided under this Agreement may not be used for any purpose designed to support or defeat any pending legislation or administrative regulation.
- d. <u>SAM.gov Requirements</u>. Subrecipient is required to have an active registration with the System for Award Management ("SAM") (https://www.sam.gov).
- 5. COMPLIANCE WITH GRANT REQUIREMENTS. Grant funds awarded must be used solely for the purposes identified in Paragraph 2 of this Agreement. In accordance with Paragraph 11, Subrecipient agrees to indemnify, defend, and hold harmless the County of Orange for any sums the State or Federal government contends or determines Subrecipient used in violation of this Agreement. Subrecipient shall immediately return to the County any funds the County or any responsible State or Federal agency, including the Department of Treasury, determines the Subrecipient has used in a manner that is inconsistent with Paragraph 2 of this Agreement. The provisions of this paragraph shall survive termination of this Agreement.

6. REPORTS.

- a. Mid-Term Report. By October 31, 2022, Subrecipient shall provide a report to the County that shall: (1) identify the expenses paid from the Grant Amount; (2) demonstrate how Subrecipient used the Grant Amount consistent with the use requirements of Paragraph 2; and (3) identify the balance of the Grant Amount that Subrecipient has not spent.
- b. Final Report. Upon the earlier of Subrecipient's expenditure of the balance of the Grant Amount or January 30, 2023, Subrecipient shall provide a report to the County that shall: (1) identify the expenses paid from the Grant Amount; (2) demonstrate how Subrecipient used the Grant Amount consistent with the use requirements of Paragraph 2; and (3) identify the balance of the Grant Amount that Subrecipient has not spent, if any.
- c. The Subrecipient shall provide a certification signed by its City Manager or designee with each report required under this Paragraph 6 that the statements contained in the report are true and that the expenditures described in the report comply with the uses permitted under Paragraph 2.
- d. Subrecipient shall maintain supporting documentation for the reports required by this Paragraph 6 consistent with the requirements of Paragraph 7.

- 7. RECORDS MAINTENANCE. Records, in their original form, must be maintained in accordance with requirements prescribed by the County with respect to all matters specified in this Agreement. Original forms are to be maintained on file for all documents specified in this Agreement. Such records must be retained for a period of four (4) years after termination of this Agreement and after final disposition of all pending matters. "Pending matters" include, but are not limited to, an audit, litigation or other actions involving records. Records, in their original form pertaining to matters covered by this Agreement, must be retained within the County of Orange unless authorization to remove them is granted in writing by the County.
- 8. RECORDS INSPECTION. At any time during normal business hours and as often as either the County, Inspector General acting pursuant to the Inspector General Act of 1978, or the Auditor General of the State of California may deem necessary, Subrecipient must make available for examination all its records with respect to all matters covered by this Agreement. The County, Inspector General, and the Auditor General of the State of California each have the authority to audit, examine and make excerpts or transcripts from records, including all Subrecipient's invoices, materials, payrolls, records of personnel, conditions of employment and other data relating to all matters covered by this Agreement. Subrecipient agrees to provide any reports requested by the County regarding performance of this Agreement. With respect to inspection of Subrecipient's records, the County may require that Subrecipient provide supporting documentation to substantiate Subrecipient's expenses with respect to the Subrecipient's use or expenditure of monies provided by the County to the Subrecipient under this Agreement.
- 9. INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR. The Subrecipient shall be considered an independent contractor and neither the Subrecipient, its employees, nor anyone working under the Subrecipient shall be considered an agent or an employee of County. Neither the Subrecipient, its employees nor anyone working under the Subrecipient shall qualify for workers' compensation or other fringe benefits of any kind through County.
- 10. PERMITS, LICENSES, APPROVALS, AND LEGAL OBLIGATIONS. Subrecipient shall be responsible for obtaining all permits, licenses, and approvals required for performing any work under this Agreement. Subrecipient shall be responsible for observing and complying with any applicable Federal, State, or local laws, or rules or regulations affecting any such work. Subrecipient shall provide copies of permits and approvals to the County upon request.
- 11. INDEMNITY. The Subrecipient agrees to indemnify, defend with counsel approved in writing by County, and hold County, its elected and appointed officials, officers, employees and agents and those special districts and agencies which County's Board of Supervisors acts as the governing Board harmless from any claims, demands or liability of any kind or nature, arising from or

related to the Subrecipient's receipt of the Grant Amount under this Agreement, including any claims that the amounts paid by the County to Subrecipient were not used consistent with the restrictions on the use of SLFRF program funds as set forth in the regulations and guidance issued by the Department of Treasury regarding the use of such funds. The provisions of this paragraph shall survive the termination of this Agreement.

12. NOTICES. All notices, requests, demands and other communications contemplated, called for, permitted, or required to be given hereunder shall be in writing. Any written communications shall be deemed to have been duly given upon actual in-person delivery, if delivery is by direct hand, or upon delivery on the actual day of receipt or no greater than four (4) calendar days after being mailed by US certified or registered mail, return receipt requested, postage prepaid, whichever occurs first. The date of mailing shall count as the first day. All communications shall be addressed to the appropriate party at the address stated herein or such other address as the parties hereto may designate by written notice from time to time in the manner aforesaid.

- 13. DEFAULTS. Should either Party fail for any reason to comply with the contractual obligations of this Agreement within the time specified by this Agreement, the non-breaching Party reserves the right to terminate the Agreement, reserving all rights under State and Federal law.
- 14. ATTORNEY FEES. In any action or proceeding to enforce or interpret any provision of this Agreement, each Party shall bear its own attorney's fees, costs, and expenses.
- 15. ENTIRE CONTRACT: This Agreement contains the entire contract between the Parties with respect to the matters herein, and there are no restrictions, promises, warranties or undertakings other than those set forth herein or referred to herein. No exceptions, alternatives, substitutes or revisions are valid or binding on the parties unless authorized by the Parties in writing.

16. AMENDMENTS. No alteration or variation of the terms of this Agreement shall be valid unless made in writing and signed by the parties; no oral understanding or agreement not incorporated herein shall be binding on either of the Parties; and no exceptions, alternatives, substitutes or revisions are valid or binding on County unless authorized by County in writing.
