On Tuesday, July 17, the City Council approved a Proclamation declaring July as Parks and Recreation Month, and acknowledging the California Parks and Recreation Society's Parks Make Life Better campaign! Two of our Commissioners and many of our Department staff were in attendance for the presentation of the Proclamation. During the presentation a short video was played.

Earlier this year, staff distributed Poster Packs for a project that invited residents to draw/color their favorite park in Costa Mesa. The Poster Pack included blank poster paper and markers.
