#### Amendment 01 to Voucher Agreement Number MP23W2A-5G Between CALSTART, Inc. and City of Costa Mesa

This Amendment number 01 ("Amendment") is dated for convenience as of May 20, 2025, and is made to Voucher Agreement Number MP23W2A-5G between City of Costa Mesa ("Awardee") and CALSTART, Inc. ("CALSTART"), executed August 5, 2024 ("Agreement"). The purpose of this amendment is to increase funding, update the financial responsibility plan, and modify the project area.

#### Recitals

- On April 1, 2019, CALSTART executed grant agreement number G17-CMDC- 01 with the State of California Air Resources Board ("CARB").
- On August 5, 2024, voucher agreement number MP23W2A-5G was executed between City of Costa Mesa ("Awardee") and CALSTART to perform tasks under the Circuit Costa Mesa (the "Project") funded under CARB agreement number G17- CMDC-01 for a period of performance from August 5, 2024, through August 5, 2029, for an amount not to exceed one million five hundred thousand and no/100 dollars (\$1,500,000).

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the promises herein, and for good and valuable consideration, the Parties agree to amend the Agreement as follows:

- Per the attached approved Additional Funding Request, funding is increased from one million five hundred thousand and no/100 dollars (\$1,500,000), to an amount not to exceed one million eight hundred thousand and no/100 dollars (\$1,800,000).
- Exhibit B (Scope of Work): Attachment 1-Budget Worksheet is replaced in its entirety per revised Exhibit B: Attachment 1 attached.
- The Financial Sustainability Plan is replaced in its entirety per the revised Financial Sustainability Plan attached.
- Per the attached approved Additional Funding Request, modify Project Area Information in Exhibit B (Scope of Work) to add the updated Project Area Map (map is attached to the Additional Funding Request).

Except as provided herein, all other terms and conditions of the Agreement shall remain unchanged and in full force and effect.

# MPV Awardees Additional Funding Request




**Hourly Pax**

Number of passengers per service day






#### Day of the Week Pax

Hi Ava,

Happy Friday! It has come to our attention that the City of Costa Mesa's launched service is operating in areas that do not meet CMO eligibility requirements and is requesting ongoing operations in those areas. Of the nine census tracts served, three do not qualify under SB 535 or AB 1550. The City has explained that service is extending to these ineligible areas (on the east side of the service area) based on their community needs assessment, which identified grocery stores and employment hubs in these locations as essential destinations for residents within the eligible service area.

An analysis of the service area indicated that the residential population within the eligible service area (westside of the service area) has limited or no access to grocery stores, community centers, and jobs, with many key destinations located just outside the eligibility boundaries. Given the community's expressed need for clean transportation options to these destinations, we support the City's decision to operate in these census tracts to allow access to destinations outside of boundaries of SB 535 and AB 1550 communities. As noted in the IM, "if community residents express a lack of clean transportation options to destinations such as a grocery store or healthier food retail stores which are located outside of the disadvantaged or low-income community boundaries, some ... service operations to/from the store would be allowed outside of boundaries."

In addition, with the proposed use of additional funds, the City of Costa Mesa seeks to expand its Let's Go Costa Mesa! service to include a nearby hospital, Hoag Hospital, Project Homekey transitional housing developments, and senior housing which also do not meet CMO eligibility requirements. Expanding service to these locations would provide residents with access to employment at the hospital, healthcare services, and grocery stores, addressing the transportation barriers identified in the needs assessment.

We recommend allowing the City to continue its current service operations and expand to the proposed hospital, transitional housing, and senior housing in the CMO non-eligible areas to provide reliable and clean transportation to underserved residents who do not have access to reliable transportation including public transit or personal vehicle. The Costa Mesa community needs assessment highlights a "lack of [transportation] service close to home/destination," and the attached heat density map further demonstrates the demand for transportation between the westside of Costa Mesa, where residents live, and the eastside, where key destinations such as employment, grocery stores, and retail locations are concentrated.
